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**Materials** needed for class are: a notebook (8-1/2 x 11) for class notes, loose-leaf paper (it should also be 8-1/2 x 11), pens or pencils (different colors), post-its, 3x5 index cards, and hi-liters (different colors).

**Textbooks** will be provided and are to be kept at home. Students will need to logon to the class website (<https://broward.edmodo.com/>) and/or the textbook website (<http://my.hrw.com/>) to submit homework assignments, download links or files, etc.

**Assessments:** formative assessments are generally given after completion of a lesson. Summative assessments are given at the end of a chapter. Pop-quizzes are random. Students who miss an assessment are to take a make-up quiz or test (essay-type format) after school or during Study Hall (if possible) at their earliest convenience.

**Grades** are based on the Broward County grading scale and will be based primarily, but not exclusively, on points earned for oral/aural comprehension, homework, quizzes, tests, etc. There are NO extra credit assignments. Make-up work is allowed for full credit and grade for *excused* absences. Make-up work is allowed for *unexcused* absences however, teacher may record a 10% reduction in the grade for HW (see above) and record the lowest passing grade (e.g., “D” or “60”) for tests and major projects that meet standards or proficiency. All make-up work must be submitted (hardcopy) within two days, not including the day of return, for each day of an absence.

**General Pacing Guide for French 2 and French 3+AP** follows the nine standards of the Florida Next Generation for World Languages. Emphasis will be placed on: Interpretive Listening (Standard 1), Interpretive Reading (Standard 2), Interpersonal Communication (Standard 3), Presentational Speaking (Standard 4), and Presentational Writing (Standard 5). ALL standards (including Standard 6: Culture; Standard 7: Connections; Standard 8: Comparisons; Standard 9: Communities) will be touched upon throughout the year. AP students will be assigned additional materials geared to their particular program. These will focus on various themes. These include: *Les défis mondiaux, La science et la technologie, La vie contemporaine, La quête de soi, La famille et la communauté et L'esthétique.*
